Oh, the memories I have growing up as part of that big ole family. Maw Maw and Paw Paw and eight children and their spouses and their children and even grandchildren. I remember Louie telling me how pretty I was as a young teen and I remember him as a teen standing out in the front yard "knocking rocks" with a baseball bat and how it had dibbiits in the wood.

I can remember when I was very small and sleeping in the same room with him when I spent the night with Maw Maw and Paw Paw...He was in the house the day I was born upstairs. He loved my Mama - who was married to his brother. T. J., and followed her around a lot when he was eight years old and told her one time that when he got grown, he was going to buy her a yellow convertible.

She teased him for years asking where her yellow convertible was. As I recall when my husband and I got married, we bought our very first living room and bedroom set from him in his furniture store. I remember as a teenager him taking me for a ride in his white convertible - I think with red interior. I lost contact with Louie except via phone in the adult years when I could call from time to time and many times on Veteran's Day to thank him for serving during the time of the Korean War. It hurts me so now to remember the last time I talked with him on the phone a few months back - and he had called me and asked me to plan a McCullough Family Reunion. I was unable because of health reasons, but told him that there just were not that many people left; but would love for him, Faye, Walker, and Dot to come to my home for dinner and he said they would like that - but we never got to do it.

My Daddy, T. J., was the oldest and he loved his family with a passion and always kept up with his folks. The last time I saw Louie was just before my Daddy died when a huge, huge group of us stood in a circle in the hospital lobby and held hands asking God to help my Dad survive the surgery which was really bad in those days...and he did and was in the hospital for eight weeks but passed away before he was able to come home.

I am sure he was at Daddy's funeral but can't recall - it was so long ago and I was in such shock. I went to visit and spend the night often with my grandmother, his mother, and she taught me so much; and we had so much fun. She taught me to crochet and I have made what seems like a billion things since I was ten years old. How I do run on... but just wanted his family to know that he was loved greatly by me. And at 77 and in ill health it won't be long before I will be with them all on both sides of my family; Stephens and McCullough. I won't say rest in peace, Louie, for I am sure you have already gotten that new body and are playing baseball somewhere in heaven. I do so love you. Your niece, Patricia McCullough Walston (Patsy).
